



Connacht Cricket Union Club Safeguarding compliance guidelines

Cricket Ireland and Connacht Cricket Union as a Provincial Union are committed to safeguarding the wellbeing of its members. Every Cricket Club with youth teams and/or youth players has a duty of care not only to children but all the members of their club.

For clubs to be compliant in their Safeguarding obligations, the following four steps must be followed and completed in full prior to the season with a commitment to ensuring that step 5 will be completed as and when an individual is required to be vetted.

Steps to be completed:

- 1) Review and complete the Child Safeguarding statement ([template](#)) display and promote to members and stakeholders (on club website and/or displayed in club)
- 2) Review and complete Safeguarding Risk assessment ([template](#)) formally agree any actions and make available to members
- 3) Appoint a Club Children's officer (ROI/NI) and Designated liaison person (ROI), these persons must be vetted and appropriately trained ([Cricket Ireland Safeguarding Pack Section 1](#))
- 4) Implement Cricket Ireland's Safe recruitment policy - ([Cricket Ireland Safeguarding Safe Recruitment & training policy](#)) Ensuring all coaches/volunteers working with children attend Safeguarding training, and are vetted as well as being aware of CI code of conduct and reporting procedures
- 5) All persons in the club who will be in continuous or regular contact with children and or vulnerable people must complete their Garda vetting or Access NI prior to beginning their role [Cricket Ireland Vetting documents and policy](#)

Send a confirmation email to Provincial Union to confirm all the above, please include name and contact details of persons in named positions (Designated Liaison / Children's Officer positions)
